## **Mane-taining Appearances**

"Most clients with thin hair really aren't looking for an impossibly thick mane, despite what they initially ask you to do," smiles Vikki Parman, a stylist for 30 years, extension wearer for 10 years and co-owner of Di Biase Hair Extensions USA. "But they are looking for enough hair to give them style choices that are available to people with naturally thick hair.

"When doing hair addition services as an instant solution for very thin hair, I suggest that you gradually add more extensions over two or three visits, until the client finally feels that her hair is noticeably thicker while still representing who she is as a person and her personal style. Otherwise, she may appear at your doorstep one day looking overwhelmed and asking you to remove the additional hair.

"Aside from adding thickness, volume or length, extensions are an

excellent alternative to wigs for recovering cancer patients with hair that's finally long enough to hold a keratin bond," Parman continues. "They can add highlights, lowlights or pops of color without risking fading or damage. Extensions can also improve the texture of hair, whether clients want less or more curl." (DiBiaseHairUSA.com)
